



# Liquid TIME

*We are all familiar with pouring gas into our vehicles. Some of us, unfortunately, may be too familiar with pouring money into our vehicles. But wouldn't it be nice if we had "liquid time" that we could pour into our vehicles, thus increasing their life on the road?*

**B**elieve it or not, there is something you can add to your vehicle that could be nearly as good as liquid time—a pour-in fuel system cleaner.

A pour-in fuel system cleaner is a treatment added directly to the fuel tank that spruces up dirty fuel systems, restoring them to a like-new state. It also helps improve fuel economy and helps to extend the life of your vehicle.

There are a few telltale signs to determine if your engine might need a sip of liquid time. Does your engine feel like it is shaking? Do you hear a knocking sound while you're driving? Does your vehicle just not seem like it is performing as well as it used to? If any of these describe your vehicle, there is a good chance deposits might have formed in your engine. Deposits are often little bits of carbon left over from the fuel your engine burns. These deposits can destroy your engine and shorten its life. But good news—using a pour-in fuel system cleaner

can remove these filthy deposits and add some time to your vehicle's lifetime clock.

“Using a pour-in fuel system cleaner on a regular basis will extend the life of your engine by extending the life of your fuel injectors and the life of your fuel tank,” said Mark Negast, technical director at Lucas Oil. “If your fuel tank is not made of fiberglass but is instead made of metal, moisture in your fuel tank could cause corrosion. However, a pour-in fuel system cleaner can help combat corrosion. It will definitely extend the life of your engine if you use it on a regular basis.”

A pour-in fuel system cleaner takes only

seconds to install, adding virtually no time to your oil change. Pour-in fuel system cleaners are

recommended every 3,000 to 4,000 miles—in other words, at every oil change. These treatments are worth the extra cost because they are going to help your engine run better and extend its life.

Imagine, only a few seconds and few dollars could add a few years—or more—to the life of your vehicle. After all, a pour-in fuel system cleaner is nearly as good as that liquid time you are wishing for. +
